PG&E's 2022 Supplier Diversity Annual Report and Plan

"Our partnership with diverse suppliers is more than just bolstering local economies and creating jobs. Our diverse suppliers provide the necessary goods and services to support PG&E's daily operations as we deliver for our hometowns," said PG&E Corporation CEO Patti Poppe in the 2022 annual report.

In 2022 PG&E reported \$4.79 billion with more than 600 diverse suppliers.



Annual Report Results and Highlights

PG&E embraces the decision to include PDBEs in the California Public Utilities Commission (PDUC) Supplier Diversity Program initiatives and to set incremental LGBTEs goals.
